





The eye category

The eye category in pharmacy is made up of many products, around 500, treating many issues including:

- Dry eye treatments
- Contact lense care
- Allergy treatments
- Red eye treatment
- Eye cleaning treatments
- Glaucoma treatments
- Blepharitis treatments
- As well as many specialist items and prescription drugs.







The dry eye category

The dry eye category is just one of the segments in the eye category.

There are multiple treatment options for dry eye including:

- Liquid drops
- Gel drops
- Lipid sprays
- Ointments (for overnight use)
- Prescribed drops, gels and creams.





What is dry eye?

- Dry eye is the disease state where your body produces inadequate tear volumes or has excessive tear evaporation.
- Symptoms are described as itchy, scratchy, stinging, gritty or tired eyes. Another common symptom of dry eye is overly watery eyes.
- One in four Australians suffer from dry eye.
- 80% of dry eye sufferers have a disturbance in the eye's lipid layer. This lipid layer controls tear evaporation.
- In most cases (but not always), dry eye is caused by excessive evaporation, not insufficient tears.






What is Tears Again?

Tears Again Liposomal Eye Spray that stabilises the eye's lipid layer, reducing excessive tear evaporation while hydrating and lubricating dry eyes.

Remember:


80% of dry eye sufferers have a disturbance in the eye's lipid layer. This lipid layer controls tear evaporation.






- The tear film of an eye is made up of 3 layers.
- Mucus layer
- Aqueous layer (mostly water)
- Lipid layer
- The lipid layer prevents evaporation from the aqueous layer and creates lubrication between the eyelid and the eyeball.






- If there is a disturbance in the lipid layer, water from the eye quickly evaporates away.
- This leaves the eye feeling dry, itchy and painful.





- When the eye is closed the lipid layer is pushed together by the eyelids.
- The Tears Again liposomes (microscopic balls of lipids) mix with the eye's lipid layer.
- When blinking the liposomes are spread across the surface of the eye, repairing disturbances in the lipid layer.
- Only a very small quantity of liposomes are needed to repair the defective lipid layer.





- The lipid spray repairs the disturbance in the lipid layer and therefore helps stabilise the tear film, reducing evaporation and increasing lubrication.
- Within minutes, patients experience prolonged relief.
- Tears Again can be used as often as needed.





Eye Drops

Eye drops are the most commonly used treatment for dry eye.

The problem with using drops to treat dry eye are:

- Most eye drops are 'artificial tears' that add liquid to the aqueous layer of the tear film. 80% of dry eye sufferers have a disturbance in the eye's lipid layer. Artificial tears will not resolve this issue.
- Drops can be hard to use for many people, you cannot use most drops with contact lenses in or with makeup on.
- Many drops have short shelf lives (1 month) or contain preservatives that can irritate eyes and can worsen dry eye over time.





Tears Again

- Tears Again is easier to apply than drops or gels. It is easier for elderly people and children to use due to its spray mechanism and not needing to apply to open eyes.
- There is no need to remove contact lenses when using Tears Again and it may make wearing contact lenses more comfortable as it creates lubrication between the eye and the eyelid.
- It does not smudge eye make-up.
- It is available on the Pharmaceutical Benefit Scheme (PBS) and therefore a cheaper option for people with concession cards (~\$6 for 2 units).
- Tears Again can be used by people who are sensitive to preservatives.





Tears Again

- Tears Again has a 6 month shelf life when open and a 3 year shelf life when sealed, this is because of preservatives.
- Tears Again can be used by people who are sensitive to preservatives and is specifically prescribed to people sensitive to preservatives.
- Why is this the case?
- Tears Again contains the preservative phenoxyethanol. This preserves Tears Again in the bottle, hence the long shelf life. Being an ethanol-based preservative, it is volatile and quickly evaporates when sprayed. As such, Tears Again is appropriate for long-term use, similar to a preservative-free eye drop.





Tears Again the professionals

choice

- Tears Again is the only liposomal eye spray available on the PBS. Tears Again can be prescribed by a GP, Ophthalmologist or prescribing Optometrist. Each script written is for <u>2 units of Tears Again</u> ~\$6 for a concession card holder.
- 13,500+ scripts were written in the last 12 months (that equals 27,000+ bottles of Tears Again).
- Tears Again in on the PBS "For severe dry eye patients who are sensitive to preservatives in multi-dose eye drops".
